London is home to a diverse population of people and cultures, with over 300 languages spoken in the area. Its estimated municipal population (equivalent to Greater London) in mid-2018 was 8,908,081, making it Europe's third most populous metropolis and accounting for 13.4% of the UK population.

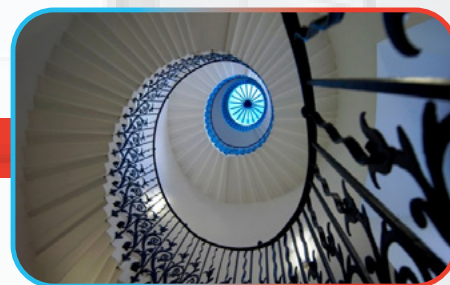

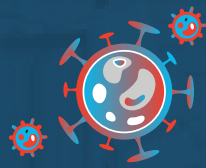
